

South African IPP SOLA appoints 3 MDs

South African IPP SOLA Group has promoted 3 managing directors to lead the renewable energy developer after CEO Dom Willis stepped down in March (2024).

Former executive chair and regional group manager Jonathan Skeen has been appointed MD commercial. Skeen's remit includes business development and group finance. He has had a varied career which includes 2 years at Spanish energy infra company Cobra Group and 12 years as an author for the French renewable energy NGO REN21.
